## Barnsley Table Tennis League Rules

- 1. That the League be called "THE BARNSLEY TABLE TENNIS LEAGUE."
- 2. That the Annual Subscription be 10s, 0d. per Club, payable before any Club can play any League games.
- 3. The League shall be governed by an Executive Committee which shall consist of a Chairman, Vice-Chairman, Joint Hon. Secretaries, Joint Hon. Treasurers, and one representative from each Club for the time being members of the League. All officers shall retire annually but shall be eligible for re-election. Any vacancy in this Committee caused by resignation during the season shall be filled by the Committee at the meeting at which such resignation is accepted.

The Executive Committee shall have power to appoint from among its members such sub-committees as may be deemed necessary. Such sub-committees should ordinarily consist of the officers mentioned above.

- 4. A Quorum for a full Executive Committee meeting shall be five.
- 5. That the officers shall be elected annually at a General Meeting which shall ordinarily be held at the close of the season.
- 5a That all members of Clubs affiliated to the Barnsley T. T. I.. may attend any Annual Meeting.
- 5b "Voting" That for purposes of voting at any Annual or General Meeting the Club Secretary or the duly authorised representative of such Club shall be allowed to record a vote for each team which that Club ran in the League during the present or, where such meeting is held in the close season, the past season.
- 6. That the registration fee of one shilling per player registered shall be inclusive of player's handbook. Registration not valid unless accompanied by fee.
- 7. That the Rules governing match play shall be those published by the English Table Tennis Associaton.

- 8. That a Club desirous of joining the League must be proposed by a League Club, and nominated at an Executive Committee meeting or by application at a General Meeting. The closing date for applications for League membership shall be at the Annual General Meeting held at the close of the season.
- 9. That all teams shall play one Home match and one Away match with every other team in their division of the League, all teams playing one match per week.
- 10. That teams competing in the League Competition shall consist of five players. Each player of one team shall play each player of the opposing team one game. A game shall be won by the player who first wins twenty-one points, unless both players have scored twenty points each, when the winner shall be the player who first wins two points more than his opponent. That players change ends when the first one reaches a score of ten. The match must be played to a finish, and the team winning the majority of the games shall be awarded two points in the competition.
- 11. That the Home Team has first choice of date and must give its opponents at least seven clear days notice when informing them of the date fixed. Should the home team fail in this point then the Away team takes choice and may notifiy the Home Team of the date on which it will present itself. The team being advised of date offered for match must reply within two days comfirming the date.
- 12. That in the event of any team not fulfilling an engagement its opponents shall be awarded the match unless another date be mutually agreed upon prior to the date originally fixed. Any team failing to fulfil an engagement, i.e., either the original fixture or the re-arranged match, as the case may be, shall be fined two shillings and sixpence. The score in an awarded match shall be reckoned as 25-nil.
- 13. That all matches shall start not later than 7-30 p.m. In the event of non-attendance of a player or players by 8-30 p.m., or such later time as may be agreed upon by the team's captains prior to the match his or her games shall be considered lost 21-nil, unless reserves be in attendance. Should a reserve be required to play, he or she shall play on throughout the match. In the event of both teams being one man short the odd game may be claimed by the visiting team.

NOTE—Where possible, any alteration of the time limits for attendance of players should be agreed upon when arranging the date of the match.

- 14. That the secretary of the Home team shall notify the League Secretary of the result of the match by first post on Monday morning following match date, giving the names of the playes and full scores. Results and scores shall be returned on official postcrads. Any Club infringing this rule will be fined sixpence.
- 15. The Umpires for each game shall be agreed upon mutually, and scoring shall be undertaken alternately by a member of the visiting and home teams. In case of dispute as to who shall score, the visiting captain shall name the scorer. The captains alternately shall chose the order of play in regard to their own players, the visiting captain to have first choice.
- 16. That the teams obtaining the greatest number of points shall be declared Division Champions. In the case of a Tie, a deciding match shall be played on a neutral table. The League shall award a Cup to the Division Champions, and the club holding a Division Trophy shall provide safe security for keeping same, and shall return it when requested.
- 17. That at the end of the season, the teams that hold the two bottom places in Division I shall be relegated to Division II, and the two leading teams of Division II shall be promoted to Division I, providing that the clubs from which the teams are entered apply for and are granted affiliation during the proper period prior to the following season. In all cases the constitution of the Division shall be decided by the Executive Committee. If extra divisions are necessary promotion and relegation to higher and lower divisions respectively to apply as in Divisions I and II.
- 18. A player registered with the "A" team of any particular club may be played in the first team of that club providing that the number of his appearances with the first team shall not exceed five in one season.
- 19. That no player shall be eligible to play in a League game until he has been registered three clear days, and each player shall be a bonifide member of the Club for which he or she may be registered. No player may be registered for more than one club at a time. If a player desires to transfer from one club

to another he shall make personal application to the Executive Committee, and the Executive Committee's decision shall be final. A transfer fee of one one shilling per player shall be payable at the discretion of the Executive Committee, No transfers or registrations shall be allowed after the second Saturday in February.

- 20. That any club playing an ineligible player shall be fined not less than one shilling, and the ineligible player's games shall be reckoned as lost 21-nil.
- 21. That in the event of a team retiring from the League for any reason during the season, no money shall be refunded, and all the matches played by that team shall be declared void.
- 22. That fines shall be paid within one month, after which clubs owing five shillings or more in fines shall be suspended from playing in all matches until the full amount be paid.
- 23. That all protests with claims shall be in writing, and shall be lodged with the League Secretary within seven days after the match. The club protesting must also send a copy of the claim and protest to the opponents concerned.
- 24. That each club must provide suitable accommodation and lighting facilities for matches to the satisfaction of the Executive Committee.
- 25. That the make of the ball to be used in all matches shall be selected from the E.T.T.A. list by the Annual General Meeting and be named in the handbook.
- 26. Each club shall send a representative, or a note explaining non-attendance, to all Executive Committee meetings, such person having power to vote. Failure to comply with this rule will entail a fine of not less than one shilling.
- 27. The composition of the Divisions of the League Competition shall be decided by the Executive Committee after the closing date for application for membership.
- 28. That the Hon-Treasurer shall present accounts for the preceding year at the Annual General Meeting, such accounts to be audited by two auditors appointed from among the members at the previous Annual General Meeting. The auditors shall retire annually, but shall be eligible for re-election.
- 29. That in the event of any question arising not provided for in the foregoing rules such question shall be referred to the Executive Committee and the decision of that Committee shall be final and binding.

That no amendment to or alteration of these Rules shall be made except at an Annual General Meeting, when fourteen days' notice shall be given, or by vote of a Special General Meeting which may be called at any time on the requisition of one half of the number of clubs in the League, in which case seven clear days' notice shall be given, or unless all clubs being represented at a General Meeting unanimously agree to such alteration.

#### N.B.—Rule 10 and II must be strictly adhered to.

#### Tournament Details

All tournaments will be played under the rules of the E.T.T.A. Handicapping will be in the hands of the Selection Committee

All tournaments will be closed to members of clubs affiliated to the Barnsley T.T.L., except the Closed Open for Barnsley Championships, when a player will be eligible if he or she becomes an associate member of the North End Club at a fee of 6d. per person, and provided he or she resides in a district served by the B.B.C.S.

#### Fees-

Closed Open. 1s. each singles and 9d. each doubles Youth's singles 6d. each Handicap singles 9d. each Men's 3 a-side League Competition, 1s. per team Seasonal Handicap 6d. each player all events

In the Seasonal Handicap events, these will be played throughout the season with home player(s) having choice of table. Each round will be drawn separately when all Club Secretaries of the players concerned will be informed accordingly.

Winning players must send result to Mr. F. B. Walker within 24 hours of the match being played in all seasonal events.

All fees must accompany the entry form, otherwise the entry will be ignored.

All players must play in shirt or blouse of one colour, not white or light, except for badge which may be worn.

In seasonal events players with choice of table must offer their opponents the choice of at least two dates, excluding Saturdays and Sundays at least seven days before the first date offered. Matches not played by the closing date for each round; the offending players will be scratched.

All business appertaining to League matches, will be attended to by Mr. F. H. Rogerson. Results of League matches to be sent to him.

Tournaments and General business by Mr. F. Walker. Players' Registration Fees to be forwarded to Mr. J. D. Cook Other matters of finance to be in the hands of Mr. C. Bradley.

#### Standard Playing Conditions

(To be adhered to where possible.)

- 1. Playing Space. It shall be free from all obstructions, and in particular from moving spectators and from spectators sitting behind the players.
- 2. **Floor**. The floor shall be firm and even and shall not be unduly slippery. The best floor surface is wood smooth but not slippery.
- 3. Lighting. Thoroughly satisfactory lighting is provided by three fairly new 100 watt pearl electric lamps, drawn opposite the middle of the table. one over the net, one six feet on either side of it, at a height of 10 feet, reflected downwards and shaded. Other lighting adopted should come as near to this standard as possible, in particular in respect of strength, equal distribution (especially back from the table) and absence of dazzle.

There should be no unshaded lights beyond the ends of or alongside the playing space likely to reflect on to the table or otherwise to unsight the players and no illuminated light background or object behind the players.

- 4. Table. The table shall comply with Rule I of the Laws of Table Tennis, in particular in size, height, regularity, bounce, non-reflection, edge. It may now be of any material, provided it gives the standard bounce.
- 5. **Net and Supports.** The net and supports shall comply with Rule 2 of the Laws of Table Tennis. The net must extend six inches beyond each side of the playing surface.
- 6. Clothing. A player shall not wear light clothing calculated to unsight his opponent.
